This document contained basic information about the Gambia. This document will enable visitors to understand The Gambia environment in order to ease their daily routine and transactions while in The Gambia. The document will equally assist visitors and guide them through some basic information they need to know about The Gambia during their stay. Basic information like electricity voltage, local language, hotels, temperature and climate change, etc. These are basic information our visitors should know, particularly the OIC conference Hall where the event will be hosted.

COUNTRY SIZE, LOCATION AND POPULATION

The Gambia is the smallest Country in West Africa with its capital city in Banjul. It has an area of 11, 295 square kilometres and has a short coastline on the Atlantic Ocean but is otherwise completely surrounded by Senegal.

The Gambia is commonly known as the smiling coast of Africa and is mainly flat and low-lying strip of land bisected by the river Gambia. It has rocky hills to the east and many sandy beaches along the coast.

According to World Population Review, the population of The Gambia is about 2,466,593 million as of 16th day of March 2021.

CURRENCY AND EXCHANGE RATE

The official currency of the Republic of The Gambia is the **Gambian Dalasi (GMD)**, which is subdivided into 100 bututs. The Gambia currency (the dalasis) was first adopted in 1971, when it replaced the British pound sterling.

ETHNIC DIVERSITY AND LANGUAGE

English is the official language of The Gambia but French is spoken quite widely. In addition, some staff in hotels, restaurants and excursion agencies speaks other languages as well including German, Italian, Dutch, French and the Scandinavian languages. There is religious diversity and tolerance in The Gambia. In addition, Islam and Christianity has remained the most common practice faith in The Gambia.

The Gambia is one of the most religious tolerant and peaceful nations in the world. Indeed, most people are inter-related, regardless of their religious backgrounds; it is not uncommon to find Muslims and Christians married to each other, or closely connected. Religious days and feasts- both Christians and Muslims are celebrated nationally. This has been the case since time immemorial, and continues today. Muslims account for 85% of the population. The other 15% is comprised of Christians and practitioners of other African tradition religious.

ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

Tourism is a major industry in The Gambia. Aside from the tourist industry, the country also has other industries such as agriculture, agro processing, fisheries, livestock and manufacturing.

CLIMATE

The Gambia lies within the tropical sub-humid eco-climatic zone with rainfall range between 800 and 1200mm annually. The climate is characterised by two seasons, wet season (between June and October) and a dry season (between November to April). The dry season is a 6-7 months of no rains. During the dry season, the climate is dominated by dry and dust-laden winds blows from the Sahara Desert in the northeast. These north-easterly winds are locally known as 'Harmattan'. The early part of the dry season November through February is generally cooler with minimum temperature of less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit common occurrence.

TEMPERATURE RANGES

The average temperatures in The Gambia range from 18 to 28 degrees Celsius (65 to 82 degrees Fahrenheit) in January to 23 to 36 degrees Celsius (75 to 97 degrees Fahrenheit) in June. Higher temperatures are recorded as one travels east with mean maximum in summer months reaching 43 degrees Celsius around Basse Santo Su. Highest temperature ever recorded in the Gambia was 45 degrees Celsius (113 degree Fahrenheit) and the lowest temperature recorded was 9 degree Celsius (48 degrees Fahrenheit).

Temperature in Banjul and Kombo are moderated by Atlantic Ocean with less seasonal and daily variability in daytime temperature. In an average year temperatures exceed 35 degrees Celsius (95 degrees Fahrenheit) for only 34 days in Banjul compared to 112 days in Basse Santo su. During the Harmattan season, (December through March) temperatures fall below 18 degrees Celsius (65 degrees Fahrenheit) for no more than 10 in Basse Santo Su compared to 56 days in Banjul and Kombo.

Climate change and the fluctuation of the weather have devastating effect on human and natural resources. However, during the raining season, agricultural activities such as farming usually benefit from the raining season due to the heavy down pour which is a boost to the growth of farm products.

ELECTRICITY VOLTAGE

The standard electricity voltage in the Gambia is 230 Volts and the frequency is 50 Hz. You can use your electric appliances in Gambia if your country's standard voltage is between 220-

240 Volts (as in the UK, Europe, Australia and most of Asia and Africa). Manufacturers take these small deviations into account. If the standard voltage in your country is in the range of 100 V-127 V (as in the US, Canada and most South American countries), you can also consider a combined power plug adapter/voltage converter.

It is not advisable to use your appliances if the frequency in the Gambia (50 Hz) differs with that of your country. Be careful with moving, rotating with time related appliances like clocks, shaver or electric fan heaters. Check the label on the appliance because some appliances never need a converter. If the label states 'INPUTS: 100-240V, 50/60Hz' the appliance can be used in all countries in the world; this is common for chargers of tablets/laptops, photo cameras, cell phones, toothbrushes, etc

GLOBAL SYSTEM FOR MOBILE COMMUNICATION (GSM) OPERATORS

The Gambia has four (4) GSM operators, namely:

- 1. Gamcel
- 2. Comium

- 3. Africell

Gamcel is the only national GSM Company and the rest are privately owned entities. The Headquarters of most of these GSM companies are located around Kairaba Avenue. Guests are at liberty to make use of their services.

LOCAL LANGUAGES

The most spoken local languages within Banjul and Kanifing Municipality are basically Wollof, Mandinka and Fula. However, other languages are mainly common in other Regions of the country.

The common way of greeting in the Gambia is "Assalaamu Alaykum", which is an Arabic word meaning "peace be with you". The reply is "Wa Alaykum Salaam", which is also an Arabic meaning " and peace be upon you"
